How I came to be a member of HVRA.

HOW: HVRA membership is required for participation in all HVRA events as per our liability insurance coverage.

Swap meet rules...pretty simple: (HVRA membership required) 1. park in rear parking lot, 2. open up trunk (use your own tables if necessary, 3. sell or trade (swap) as needed, 4. all transactions are directly between seller and buyer (no fees to EPO or to HVRA), 5. Remember to attend the HVRA auction at about 9AM.

Auction Rules: 1. HVRA Membership required, 2. auction registration required (see Brett Martin and also receive drawing tickets, described below, 3. all of your auction items must have an attached auction control form, completed with your name, registration number, the correct lot number and condition and description of lot, 4. No sold or passed items should be removed from auction area until participants settle their accounts with the treasurer....HVRA will retail a 10% commission from all sold lots (seller's fee).

What will be there? EPO will host our event as they have so generously done in the past. Annual membership dues can be paid on site and we should have HVRA caps and CDs for sale too. Coffee, juice, kolaches, etc. will be on hand for a small fee, so don't despair over missing breakfast! EPO will open their back door for access to their restroom. EPO will also provide auction tent coverage, chairs, coffee, and sound system.

There are very few estate items up for auction (i.e., used tubes, books, paper products, etc.). This is your chance to bring everything you want to sell (but please no junk).

So, load up your truck, trunk, rickshaw, or whatever and join the fun. Also, during the auction, \$120.00 in gift certificates will be awarded by drawing, to lucky ticket holders. The gift certificates include: two \$30.00 certificates, and one \$60.00 certificate, all redeemable for purchases at EPO. Again, club membership is required to obtain a ticket for prizes. 

- This year, we will honor WBAP radio for their anniversary of 100 years of broadcasting.





THE BATTLESHIP TEXAS





THE NEWEST SUPERDREADNOUGHT OF OUR NAVY Some of our newer members have asked, "why is our club involved with the Battle-ship Texas, I don't understand the connection?" Let me explain:

Sometime around the year 2001, former HVRA President Frank Cooper and I were approached by ship staff regarding several types of radio equipment, aboard the one hundred year old ship. The equipment in question was from the mid to late 1930's and through the WW II era. During 2001, a group of HVRA volunteers moved several truck loads of era radio gear from a storage building near the Houston Ship Channel into a third deck radio room for public viewing. In later years, my son, Konrad, and I restored two WW II receivers to working order; more HVRA volunteers installed a working transmitter near the ship that advertised both the ship and San Jacinto Battleground on 770 KHz AM for about a five mile radius. Later, several volunteers, including myself, restored WW II era1MC and RBO sound systems so announcements could be made aboard the ship via the public address system and era music played via the RBO reproducers. Yes, this involved a lot of work but was well worth the effort. The ship staff also provided a HAM shack on the second deck where HVRA operators and other HAM clubs could go on the air several times a year.

The Battleship attracted hundreds of thousands of visitors each year and was a venue for promoting interest in vintage radio electronics. Thousands of scouts spent overnight events on board – a wonderful opportunity for us to connect with the younger generation. Here is where we needed HVRA members to lend a hand.

During special events such as "Christmas Aboard the Battleship" in early December, I would dress up as a WW II sailor (I'm really a US Army vet), in the mail room, and I would telegraph messages to Santa for children lined up for me to send their wishes to the North Pole – this was fun! Across the corridor the HAM shack was abuzz with people lining up to get in to see and hear the folks on the air.

Yes, we were also raising money for restorations in our auctions, your HVRA auction donations even helped purchase replacement Marconi antennas. Now you see, this is how and why we were involved there.

More restorations await us as the ship undergoes badly needed repairs in the Galveston dry dock where she will remain for the next two to two and one half years. Where she will end up after the 35 million dollar repairs are completed, is anyone's guess at this time.



This photo was taken on August 31, 2022 as the Battleship was being towed down the Houston Ship Channel on her way to the dry dock in Galveston, Texas. Notice the differences in the two photos.

The cage masts were removed and replaced with the two tripod masts, during renovations probably in

the late 1920's. One of the two smokestacks remained for use after she was converted from coal to an oil burner. Now six boilers replaced the previous fourteen coal fired boilers to provide the twelve thousand horsepower needed for the ship's propellors. Nineteen of the second deck 5 inch guns were removed and the six that re-

mained were moved to the main deck, of which you can see three in this port side mid ship view, three others are mounted opposite on starboard. However, the ten fourteen inch guns, and their five, six hundred ton turrets remain in the same positions as in the above photo. Hopefully the battleship HAM call NA5DV will penetrate the ether again in a few years. So until then 73. Bill Werzner, past-president, HVRA
