- **In order to remain on the current HVRA rolls and retain the same bidder number, you are requested to renew your 2023 memberships prior to May 31, 2023.**

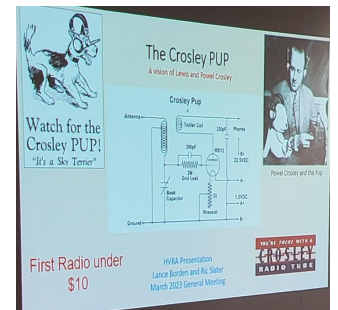

Due to the file sizes, Ric.s and Lance’s presentations are only available at HVRA.org.

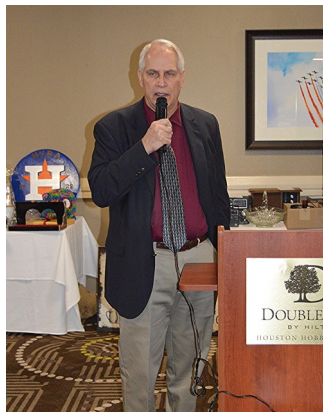
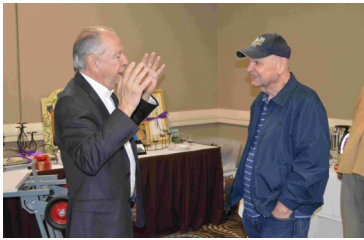

Did You Miss Some Good Opportunities? By Jerry Sirkin, Estate Coordinator

The 2023 Annual Convention is now in our rearview mirror, but the review still continues. In spite of all the hard work preparing for the event and for all of the dedicated volunteers making each day’s agenda proceed without significant problems, the low membership attendance, fewer lots for bidding, and the lack of aggressive/competitive bidding is under discussion by the Board to see if more can be done to improve next year’s 2024 convention’s results.

But as Estate Coordinator, my story begins with a **BIG THANK YOU** to all whom did attend, buy and sell, and to the members and non-members relying on me to bring, to the convention, more than 150 radios and radio related items either as part of their estates to be sold or as pure donations to HVRA.

Also, a big thank you to HVRA members taking their personal time to assist me in assessing and transporting these items. Steve Scheel was instrumental in evaluating those items brought to his attention as Webmaster and then informing me of the contact information to get my efforts underway. John Schmitt (Bellville) and Pat Zapaia (Bryan) met me twice in Brehnam to help access, load and transport many items from Art and June Clarks estate. Additionally, a big thanks to Johnny Knight (of Humble) for transporting a Philco tombstone from Mont Belview. After the passing of Joe “Hoss”, Karen Wendler continued their membership and offered to sell about 80 radios from his collection. She not only spent time with me to access, review and tag the individual lots, she pleasantly surprised me, when I arrived to pack up and transport, with many of the lots already safely packed and boxed...a great help to my back. When Brett Martin arrived during his lunch break, our task of loading my SUV was swift and organized.

Of the 158 estate lots shown, 127 were sold during the Friday and Saturday auctions and an additional few were sold during the Sunday swap meet, The remaining lots were taken back to storage and will reappear at the July 8th mega auction. These items presented to the convention membership came from Karen Wendler (78), Art Clark (40), Ronnie Schenzer (20+), Shelly Fitz (4), and the remaining items from the John Orahood estate (23). These combined lots sold for \$2200, netting HVRA over \$800. Plenty of good deals to the convention attendees.

Well, this year we held our own with 22 exhibits at this convention vs. the 21 exhibits just before the pandemic. With 77 registered conventioners that amounts to a 27% participation Last year we enjoyed a participation of 33 exhibits. Another noteworthy number was the 5 first time contestants for this year. Stepping up and out of the audience comfort zone is a key indicator of optimism, sacrifice, energy and focus. We thank you for entering the experience. As we used to say in the aerospace industry, see one, do one, teach one. You five are now in the ‘teach one’ category.

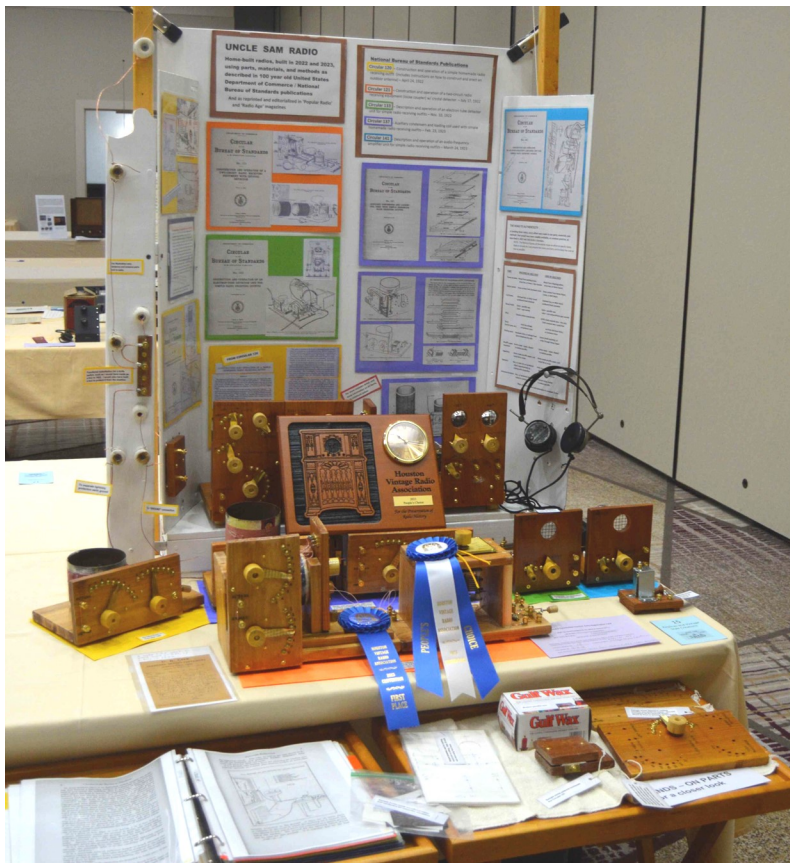

**TEXAS CITY HAMFEST and HVRA 2023 MEGA AUCTION
DOYLE CONVENTION CENTER TEXAS CITY JULY 8, 2023**



The Texas City “HAMFEST” hosted by TARS will be held in the Doyle Convention Center, 2010 5th Ave. North, Texas City. HAMs, DX’ers, collectors, tinkerers, and curious individuals will be on hand, swapping and selling throughout the center. You will find just about anything electronic among the many tables, trunks, and tail gates. HVRA will have a table inside the air conditioned auditorium distributing newsletters and club brochures to all who stop for a visit. Plan to arrive around 7 AM or possibly earlier, to get a good place to park as the lot fills up fast. Food and drinks will be available inside. There is an admission charge of \$5.00 to enter the Hamfest area.

The HVRA Summer Mega Auction will start at 12 Noon in the adjoining Exhibit Room.

- All Mega Auction attendees not paying \$5.00 for the Hamfest must enter the Mega Auction room through the side hallway door, not through the Hamfest area.
- Set up of the Mega Auction will begin near 8AM; sellers may begin staging their items at 9AM. Please bring your items through the side hallway door, not through the Hamfest area.
- The Mega Auction will begin at 12 Noon.
- All items to be auctioned must be placed in the pre-auction area prior to 12 Noon. No late or last minute entries after 12 noon will be accepted for the auction.
- Selling and bidding at this HVRA Auction is free to all active HVRA members.
- Everyone anticipating selling or bidding must register and receive a bid card with a bidder (seller’s) number.
- All items presented for auction must be labeled with an HVRA seller’s auction control form and contain the seller’s number, lot number and a brief description.
- No items (bought, sold or passed) can be picked up until the conclusion of the auction, approximately at 4PM, when the check-out process begins.
- At check-out, all sellers will pay HVRA a 15% commission on each successful sale. Payments can be made by cash, check or credit card.
- For those attendees not active members of HVRA on July 8th. the Board has approved a “One Day Membership” for \$5.00. This will allow Hamfest and other non-member attendees to participate in the HVRA auction as buyer and/or seller.
- As in all HVRA events observers are always welcome.

ACCESS TO THE COMPONENTS OF THE RCA SIX TUBE CATACOMB BY GILBERT HEDGE

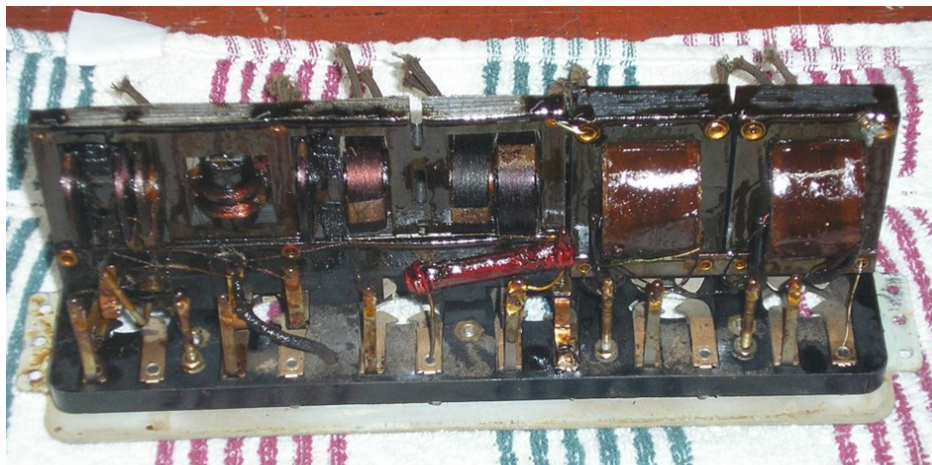
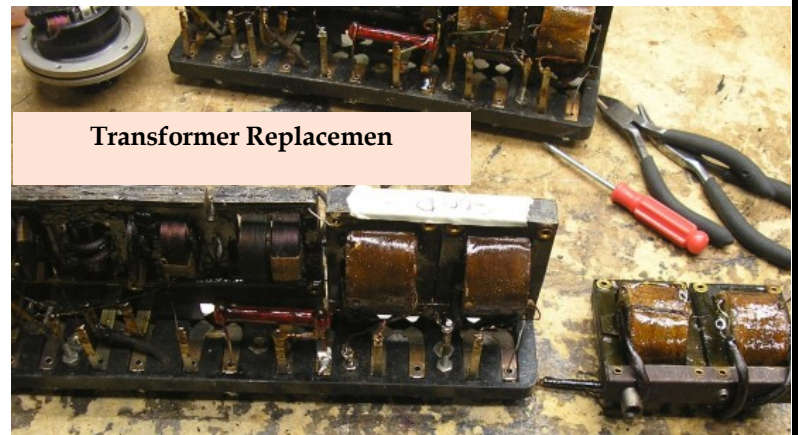
The chassis is separated from the catacomb by gently prying and pulling the metal can from around the resin coated chassis. The resin does not adhere to the tin can, but it is tight and may take some time and effort. Just go slowly and try not to damage the can or chassis.

A wood bracket was made for holding the assembly. The bracket was placed in a pan that would catch the melting resin. The assembly was cooked in the oven at 300 degrees for a couple of hours.

I have done at least 3 of these and there was very little odor in the kitchen, not even a comment from my wife.

One of the benefits of using this method to remove the resin from the chassis is that none of the resin gets into the tube sockets, however it would have been much easier to just turn the whole assembly upside down and melt the resin and let it drain out through the tube socket holes.

Once the chassis is cleaned, be careful as there are many fine connecting wires throughout.
