

ANNUAL MEETING AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS' ELECTIONS SEPTEMBER 28, 2024

Each September, we take time, during our General Meeting, to hear annual reports from Board Members and Committee Chairmen regarding their assigned duties as related to HVRA business and events.

Additionally, September is the month for electing volunteers to make a 2 year commitment to serve on the Board of Directors. During this September Meeting, the following 2 year term positions need to be filled: President, Treasurer, Historian, At Large Position 2, and At Large Position 4. Also, we are looking for a volunteer to complete the remaining 1 year as Vice President. Please refer to the following descriptions and duties for these positions as per the current By-Laws

President (Term 9/2024 – 2026) Current President: Joe Gernand

<u>Paragraph 1</u>. Shall lead the membership in a manner consistent with the Association objectives (**ARTICLE II**) and these Bylaws.

- Paragraph 2. Shall preside at all meetings of the Association and the Executive Board.
- <u>Paragraph 3</u>. Shall appoint all committees and chairpersons, except for those assigned to the Vice President.
- Paragraph 4. Shall recommend, appoint, or remove the Association Auctioneer.
- Paragraph 5. Shall appoint or be chairman of the program committee.

Vice President (Remaining Term 9/2024 – 2025... 1 yr) Current V.P: Ric Slater

- <u>Paragraph 1</u>. In the absence of the President, the Vice President shall serve in the President's place.
- <u>Paragraph 2</u>. If the Presidential post is vacated, the Vice President shall become interim President.
- Paragraph 3. Shall assist the President.
- Paragraph 4. Shall be responsible for the Annual Show and Auction.

<u>Treasurer (Term 9/2024 – 2026)</u> Current Treasurer; Brett Martin

<u>Paragraph 1</u>. The Treasurer is the officer entrusted with the accounts and funds of the Association. These funds shall be maintained in a bank account as approved by the Executive Board. Signature authority on this account shall consist of the President, the Vice President and the Treasurer. Checks issued from this account will require one signature of authorization.

<u>Paragraph 2</u>. Shall maintain a detailed record of all transactions, collections, and disbursements of funds, goods, and Association dues. These records will be maintained in a form as approved by the Executive Board.

<u>Paragraph 3.</u> Shall keep an accounting of membership dues and assist the Editor in notifying members at least one month in advance of membership expiration.

<u>Paragraph 4.</u> Shall make records available for audits as directed by the Executive Board and shall make records available within five days for any special audit.

<u>Paragraph 5.</u> The Treasurer shall prepare an annual report to be presented at the Annual Meeting.

<u>Historian (Term 9/2024 – 2026)</u> Current Historian: Ric Slater

Paragraph 1. Shall maintain all historical records of the Association including one copy of each Association publication.

<u>Paragraph 2</u>. Shall maintain a copy of the Official history of the Association in a "scrap book along with suitable photographs and newspaper clippings regarding the activities of the Association and its members

Representative at Large - Position Two (Term 9/2024 - 2026) Currently: Tom Taylor

<u>Paragraph 1</u>. Shall serve as Contest Chairperson at the Annual Show and Auction.

Paragraph 2. Shall perform other special tasks as assigned by the President

Representative at Large - Position Four (Term 9/2024 - 2026) Currently: Steve Scheel

<u>Paragraph 1</u>. Shall be responsible for working with assessment, coordination, and inventorying of estates that HVRA will assist with liquidation.

<u>Paragraph 2</u>. Shall maintain the HVRA policy for terms and condition that HVRA will enter into with estates. Said terms and conditions shall be voted on for approval by the Board of Directors.

Paragraph 3. Shall seek assistance from board members and other club members in the execution of their duties.

TEXAS CITY HAMFEST and HVRA 2024 MEGA AUCTION RESULTS

This annual event was held in Texas City on July 13th. Unfortunately, this was only 5 days after Hurricane Beryl brought a path of destruction thru the Galveston—Houston—Woodlands metroplex, leaving behind, locally flooded areas, fallen trees, downed electrical wires, damaged residences. Since HVRA members and the general public were left with many days of power outages, boiling water notices, and cleanup from the energy expended by this Category I storm, we greatly effected in attendance and participation at both the Hamfest and the HVRA Mega Auction. Observers noticed that about half of the TARS Hamfest tables were vacant and only about 25 to 30 people participated in the HVRA Auction. Preliminary auction results indicate that HVRA hamfest sales and auction commissions were sufficient to pay our obligated \$250.00 facility charge. Although the results were not as anticipated, several participants found good deals at reasonable prices and sellers returned home with fewer items to take up space in garages, attics and closets.
